# COVID-19 Vaccines and Babies

## Is the vaccine safe for babies?

### Yes.

COVID-19 vaccines approved in Canada are tested and safe for use in children 6 months and older.



## Why should I get a vaccine for my baby?

COVID-19 can spread in all people, including babies. To prevent the spread of COVID-19, including risk of serious illness, vaccination is strongly recommended.



## Does COVID-19 affect babies?

### Yes.

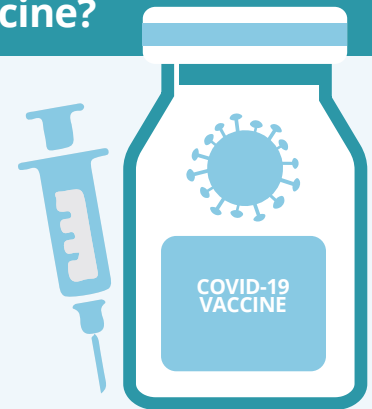
Most children who get COVID-19 have mild illness, but some can get very sick and need hospital care. Vaccines help prevent severe illness due to COVID-19.



## Can my baby get COVID-19 from the vaccine?

### No.

The COVID-19 vaccines do not contain the virus, only instructions to your body on how to fight against it.
